

James Anderton was the illegitimate son of Mary Anderton. When Mary subsequently married James Warburton, James junior adopted his step father's name, though Anderton continued to be used by James at times, and it was used as a forename in the family.

First Generation

1. Mary Anderton.

She first did not marry **Unknown**.

They had one child:

- 2** i. **James Anderton Warburton** (1777-1846)

On 6 May 1783 Mary second married **James Warburton** in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire. James was born in Haslingden, Lancashire, in 1763. He was christened in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire, on 13 Nov 1763.

James is most likely the son of Thomas and Mary nee Rishton, of Heap Clough. He was christened on November 13th 1763. Other Jamses christened at Haslingden are otherwise accounted for, though he could be new to the area.

Second Generation

2. James Anderton Warburton (*Mary Anderton*¹). James Anderton was born in Haslingden, Lancashire, in 1777. He was christened in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire, on 10 May 1777. James Anderton died in Sheep Green, Haslingden, Lancashire, on 5 May 1846. He was buried in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire, on 10 May 1846.

The identification of James Anderton Warburton is thanks to the detective work of Stephen Carr.

He was baptised as the son of Mary, a single woman, with no indication in the records as to who the father was. On May 6 1783 Mary Anderton married a James Warburton at Haslingden St James. Subsequently James seems to have used the names Anderton and Warburton almost interchangeably. The record of his marriage to Betty Butterworth on 19 Jun 1798 shows his name was originally entered as Warburton in two places, including his signature, but that it was then crossed out and replaced with Anderton.

There is a curious gap between the baptisms of Charles in 1801, and Mary Anne in 1814, but as they are both buried with their parents they are clearly the same family.

James is simply from Haslingden on Mary Anne's baptism, but for the burial of Elizabeth in July 1817 he is in Sheep Green. Elizabeth's baptism is unknown and her burial as an infant suggests she was very young.

James was living in Sheep Green at the time of his death. He was buried in grave F277, where he was called James Anderton Warburton, a stonemason of Haslingden in his 70th year. This the only time Anderton is used for James, though it is used by his son Charles on his marriage as well as his grave. Also in the grave are Charles Anderton, son of James and Betty, Betty wife of James, and daughters Jenny and Mary Ann.

On 19 Jun 1798 when James Anderton was 21, he married **Betty Butterworth** in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire. Betty was born abt 1776. Betty died in Haslingden, Lancashire, on 9 Jun 1839. She was buried in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire, on 17 Jun 1839.

Betty is buried in grave F277 with husband James, daughters Jenny and Mary Ann, and son Charles. She was 61 on her burial record but in her 63rd year on her headstone.

Second Generation

They had the following children:

- i. **Sarah Andrton Warburton**. Sarah Andrton was born in Haslingden, Lancashire, abt 1799.

Sarah's baptism cannot be found, and her inclusion is based on her use of the middle name Anderton on her marriage. The date of her marriage would suggest she was probably the eldest child in the family.

On 3 Apr 1820 when Sarah Andrton was 21, she married **John Ashworth** in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire.

- 3 ii. **Charles Anderton Warburton** (1801-1866)
- iii. **Mary Ann(e) Warburton**. Mary Ann(e) was born in Haslingden, Lancashire, in 1814. She was christened in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire, on 25 Dec 1814. She was buried in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire, on 6 Jul 1840.

Mary was Mary Anne on her baptism. Her father was a stonecutter of Haslingden.

Mary Ann was buried in grave F277 with her parents, sister Jenny, and brother Charles. She was recorded as in her 24th year, but if this is the same child she was at least 25.

- iv. **Elizabeth Warburton**. Elizabeth was born in Sheep Green, Haslingden, Lancashire, abt 1816. Elizabeth died in Sheep Green, Haslingden, Lancashire, in 1817. She was buried in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire, on 13 Jul 1817.

Elizabeth is only known from her burial. He was an infant, daughter of James of Sheep Green.

- v. **Hellen Warburton**. Hellen was born in Sheep Green, Haslingden, Lancashire, in 1817. She was christened in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire, on 27 Sep 1817.
- vi. **Jenny Warburton**. Jenny was born in Haslingden, Lancashire, in 1822. She was christened in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire, on 25 Aug 1822. Jenny died in Haslingden, Lancashire, in 1834. She was buried in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire, on 13 Mar 1834.

Jenny was baptised as Jinney, father a stone cutter of Higher Lane, referred to as Jinny on her burial record, aged 11 1/2, father James of Haslingden, and buried as Jenny in grave F277 with her parents, sister Mary Ann and brother Charles. On the gravestone she is in her 13th year.

Third Generation

3. Charles Anderton Warburton (*James Anderton², Mary Anderton¹*). Charles Anderton was born in Haslingden Grane, Lancashire, in 1801. He was christened in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire, on 10 May 1801. ■ Census for Haslingden, Lancashire, in 1841. Charles (38) is a stone mason living at Rake's Foot with Ann (36), Jane (17), Edmund (14), Betty (12), James (7), and Charles (3). ■ Census for Liverpool, Lancashire, in 1851. Charles (51) is a stonemason living at 3 Boundary Street with Ann (50), James (15) a stonemason's assistant, Charles (12), Mary (10), and Ellen (10). ■ Census for Rawtenstall, Lancashire, in 1861. Charles A (51 or 57) is a stonemason living in Bank Street, Lower Booths with Alice (49) and his step children Johannah, Mary Ann, and William Taylor, and a boarder. Charles Anderton died in Edenfield, Lancashire, on 4 Feb 1866. He was buried in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire.

Charles's parents were living in the Town on his baptism record. This is probably a mistake and should be Troy which is related to Troy Quarry, which is in Grane.

Despite having his own wife and family, Charles is buried in grave F277 with his parents and 2 sisters. He was aged 65 of Nimble Nook, Edenfield on his burial record, and in his 66th year on his gravestone.

On 20 Aug 1823 when Charles Anderton was 22, he first married **Ann Heys** in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire. Ann was born abt 1801.

Third Generation

They had the following children:

- i. **Jane Warburton**. Jane was born in Haslingden, Lancashire, abt 1824. She was christened in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire, on 25 Dec 1836.

Jane's year of birth is estimated from her age in the 1841 census. She was about 12 when she was baptised with 3 of her siblings.

- ii. **Edmund Warburton**. Edmund was born in Haslingden, Lancashire, abt 1827. He was christened in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire, on 25 Dec 1836.

Edmund's year of birth is estimated from his age in the 1841 census. He was about 9 when he was baptised with 3 of his siblings.

He has not been investigated further, but there is no evidence of a family in censuses.

- iii. **Betty Warburton**. Betty was born abt 1828. She was christened in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire, on 25 Dec 1836. Betty died in Rawtenstall, Lancashire, in 1845. She was buried in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire, on 21 Jan 1845.

Betty was baptised with 3 of her siblings when aged about 7. Her father was a stone mason of Rake's Foot on her baptism record. She was the daughter of Charles of Rawtenstall, aged 16, on her burial record.

- iv. **Charles Warburton**. Charles was born abt 1832. Charles died in Sheep Green, Haslingden, Lancashire, in 1834. He was buried in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire, on 1 Jun 1834.

Charles is only known from his burial record which names his father as Charles of Sheep Green. He was aged 2.

- v. **James Warburton**. James was born in Sheep Green, Haslingden, Lancashire, abt 1834. He was christened in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire, on 25 Jan 1835.

James's father is a stone mason of Sheep Green on his baptism record. His year of birth is estimated from his age in the 1841 census, but he would be 2 years younger from his age in 1851. It would seem James was baptised again with siblings Edmund Betty, and Jane on December 25th 1836.

He has not been explored in detail, but he isn't evident in censuses after 1851.

- vi. **Charles Warburton**. Charles was born in Haslingden, Lancashire, in 1838. He was christened in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire, on 15 Sep 1838.

Charles's father was a mason of Mount Pleasant on his baptism. He was a stone mason in censuses and appears to have married and had at least one son, but he has not been investigated further.

- vii. **Ellen Warburton**. Ellen was born in Sheep Green, Haslingden, Lancashire, on 8

Third Generation

Aug 1841. She was christened in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire, on 14 Aug 1841.

Mary and Ellen were twins. The three day difference in the baptism date of the two girls is probably a transcription error. Ellen's father is a stone mason of Sheep Green on her baptism record.

- viii. **Mary Warburton**. Mary was born in Sheep Green, Haslingden, Lancashire, on 8 Aug 1841. She was christened in Haslingden, St James, Lancashire, on 17 Aug 1841.

Mary and Ellen were twins. The three day difference in the baptism date of the two girls is probably a transcription error. Mary's father is a stone mason of Sheep Green on her baptism record. A second baptism on April 2nd 1843 records him as a stone mason of Rake's Foot.

In 1861 when Charles Anderton was 60, he second married **Alice Robinson** in Rawtenstall, St Mary, Lancashire. The marriage was registered in 1q 1861 Haslingden 8e 171. Alice was born in Yorkshire abt 1812.

Alice's children in the 1861 census are Taylors so she was presumably Alice Taylor, nee Robinson.
