



## First Generation

---

### 1. James Warburton.

This family is based on information provided by Robin Hunt. Robin's tree equates this James with the son of Thomas Warburton and Susan Barnes of Haslingden, who was baptised at Haslingden, St James on January 25th 1769.

However there are a number of Jameses born in Haslingden, Tottington, and Bury between 1755 and 1770 who could be this James, especially as he was already married and widowed before he married Ann, and so could be much older than 23, the age of the son of Thomas and Susan in 1792.

James is a weaver on his marriage record, a carter on John's baptism, and a machine maker, like son John on John's second wedding declaration.

On 23 Apr 1792 James married **Ann Smith** in Bury, St Mary, Lancashire. James was described as a widower. Ann was born in Bury, Lancashire, in 1770.

They had the following children:

- i. **James Warburton**. James was born on 8 Jan 1794. He was christened in Radcliffe, Stand Unitarian Chapel, Lancashire, on 16 Feb 1794.

James's parents are named James and Ann on his baptism. James senior is a dyer.

- 2 ii. **John Warburton** (1795-1872)

## Second Generation

---

**2. John Warburton** (*James*<sup>1</sup>). John was born in Tottington, Lancashire, on 27 Jul 1795. He was christened in Radcliffe, Stand Unitarian Chapel, Lancashire, on 4 Oct 1795. ■ Census for Hartwith cum Winsley, Yorkshire, in 1841. John (48) is a mechanic living at New York with Mary (47), George (17) a mechanic, Jane (14) and Elizabeth (12) th[ro]stle spinners, Isaac (10), John (7), and Grace (4). ■ Census for Hartwith cum Winsley, Yorkshire, in 1851. John (57) is a machine maker foreman living at Newyork with Mary (56), Isaac (19) and John (16) machine maker apprentices, Grace (14), and granddaughter Mary Bromley (9). ■ Census for Clayton, Yorkshire, in 1861. John (67) is a worsted machine maker living at Patchetts with Nancy (66). This should presumably be Mary. ■ Census for Bradford, Yorkshire, in 1871. John (77) is a worsted machine maker living at Mountain with Elizabeth (61). John died in Mountain Clayton, Bradford, Yorkshire, on 18 May 1872.

John's parents are named as James and Ann Smith on an IGI pedigree file.

John declared his father to be James, a machine maker, on his second marriage. He also declared his age on that marriage, and on 3 censuses, and it was also stated on his death certificate. If his age was accurate in all cases he was born between 3rd September 1793 and late March 1794. Finally his declared place of birth was Tottington on two censuses.

I can find no on-line record of a John son of James born in this timeframe at Tottington or elsewhere nearby, though this doesn't preclude an unrecorded nonconformist baptism. The nearest is the one documented for him as born 27th July 1795, and baptised on October 4th at Stand Unitarian Chapel, father James Warburton, a carter to Mr Potter. The chapel is which is in Whitefield, part of the Radcliffe parish. As this is a nonconformist baptism it is perhaps understandable that they may need to travel 6 miles to go to the church they want.

Another child, James was baptised in 1794, son of James and Ann, so although John's mother is not named on his baptism she is probably Ann. The chapel's baptism records do not give the parents abode so James and Ann can't be shown to have lived in Tottington.

John's death registration is in 2q 1872 Bradford 9b 138, aged 78. He was described as a mechanic and died of heart disease.

On 7 Nov 1814 when John was 19, he first married **Mary Crowder** in Halifax, Yorkshire. Mary was born in Rastrick, Yorkshire, on 9 Apr 1794. She was christened in Huddersfield, Highfield Independent Chapel, Yorkshire, on 23 Apr 1794. Mary died in Mountain Clayton, Bradford, Yorkshire, on 9 Mar 1869.

Mary was the daughter of William and Sarah. She was a dissenting non-conformist. She died aged 75, wife of John a mechanic, of paralysis.

They had the following children:

- i. **James Warburton**. James was born in Brighouse, Yorkshire, on 12 Jan 1815. He was christened in Brighouse, Briidge End Chapel, Yorkshire, on 26 Feb 1815.

James has not been documented fully but he had a daughter with each wife, and is in censuses until at least 1871.

James first married **Elizabeth**.

On 25 Aug 1849 when James was 34, he second married **Susannah Waite** in Hartwith Chapel, Yorkshire. James was of full age, a widower and mechanic of Hartwith, father John, a mechanic. Susannah was of full age, a spinster of Hartwith, father Joseph, a spinning master.

- ii. **Eliza Warburton**. Eliza was born in Bradford, Yorkshire, on 15 May 1817. She was christened in Bradford, Horton Lane Independent Chapel, Yorkshire, on 4 Mar 1818.
- iii. **Harriet Warburton**. Harriet was born in Bradford, Yorkshire, on 24 Feb 1819. She was christened in Bradford, Horton Lane Independent Chapel, Yorkshire, on 9 May 1819.
- iv. **Ann Warburton**. Ann was born in Bradford, Yorkshire, on 9 Apr 1821. She was christened in Bradford, St Peter, Yorkshire, on 28 Jul 1822.

Ann's father is a machine maker from Bradford on her baptism record.

On 4 Jul 1840 when Ann was 19, she married **Mark Bramley** in Hartwith Chapel, Yorkshire. Both were of full age, Mark was a thread maker of Hartwith, father Henry a labourer. Ann was a spinster of Hartwith, father John, a mechanic. Mark was born in 1818.

- v. **George Warburton**. George was born in Bradford, Yorkshire, in 1823. He was christened in Bradford, St Peter, Yorkshire, on 27 Jul 1823.

George's father was a machine maker from Bradford on his baptism record. He has not been found in censuses after 1841.

- vi. **Elizabeth Warburton**. Elizabeth was born in Bradford, Yorkshire, in 1825. She was christened in Bradford, St Peter, Yorkshire, on 19 Jun 1825.

Elizabeth's father is a mechanic from Bradford on her baptism record.

- vii. **Jane Warburton**. Jane was born in Brighouse, Yorkshire, in 1827.

On 24 Jul 1848 when Jane was 21, she married **John Wilkinson** in Hartwith Chapel, Yorkshire. Both were of full age. John was a tailor from Hartwith, father Peter, a tailor. Jane was from Hartwith, father John, a mechanic. John and Jane had six sons and five daughters. John was born in Hartwith, Yorkshire, in 1828. He was christened in Bradford, St Peter, Yorkshire, on 9 Apr 1828. John died in 1867.

- 3 viii. **Isaac Warburton** (1831-1917)

- ix. **Joseph Warburton**. Joseph was born in Hartwith, Yorkshire, in 1833.

Joseph probably died young as he doesn't appear in censuses.

- x. **John Warburton**. John was born in Hartwith, Yorkshire, in 1834. He was christened in Dacre Providence Independant Chapel, Yorkshire.

John has not been found in censuses after 1851.

- xi. **Grace Warburton**. Grace was born in Hartwith, Yorkshire, in 1837.

On 12 Nov 1853 when Grace was 16, she married **William Benson** in Skipton Register Office, Yorkshire. William was of full age, a manager in a flax mill , living in New York, Hartwith. Grace was a minor of Chancery Lane, Skipton, father John, a mechanic.

On 2 Sep 1869 when John was 74, he second married **Elizabeth Skillington** in Leeds, St Peter, Yorkshire. The marriage was registered in 3q 1869 Leeds 9b 597. John (75) was a widower and machine maker living in Hunslet Road, father James Warburton, machine maker. Elizabeth (59) was a widow living in Hunslet Road, father Thomas Hullah, a grocer. Elizabeth was born in Winksley, Yorkshire, in 1808. Elizabeth died in Bradford, Yorkshire, in 1879.

Elizabeth was previously married to Moses Skillington who died on February 9th 1863. I have not found a record of her marriage to reveal her maiden name.



### Third Generation

---

**3. Isaac Warburton** (*John<sup>2</sup>, James<sup>1</sup>*). Isaac was born in Hartwith, Yorkshire, on 13 May 1831. He was christened in Ripon, Providence Independent Chapel (Dacre), Yorkshire, in 1831. ■ Census for Kimberworth, Yorkshire, in 1861. Isaac (29) is a machinist living in Mary Street with Jemima (38), Kate L (6), and John Tho (3). ■ Census for Rotherham, Yorkshire, in 1871. Isaac (39) is a machinist water meter living at 35 Wellgate Mt., Wellgate with Jemima (50), Kate L (16), John T (13), and Mary A (11). ■ Census for Rotherham, Yorkshire, in 1881. Isaac (49) is a machinist (water meter) living at 35 Wellgate Mt. with Jemima (60), Mary A (21), nephew Alfred Wilkinson (22) a brass worker, and a servant. ■ Census for Rotherham, Yorkshire, in 1891. Isaac (59) is a machinist for water living at Wellgate Mount (South View) with granddaughter Clara J (9), and a servant. ■ Census for Rotherham, Yorkshire, in 1901. Isaac (69) is a widowed machinist of water meters in a Brass Works, living at 35 Wellgate Mount with daughter Kate L. Barlow (46) a widowed housekeeper, and her children Florence W (24), William E (23), and Ernest (21), and granddaughter Clara J Warburton (19). ■ Census for Rotherham, Yorkshire, in 1911. Isaac (79) is a widowed machinist in a brass manufacturer, living at 35 Wellgate Mount with daughter Kate Laurette Barlow (56) and her 3 children. Isaac died in Rotherham, Yorkshire, on 8 Oct 1917. He was buried in Moorgate.

Isaac's death was registered in 1917, a retired water meter maker aged 86, at South View, Wellgate, of cerebral softening.

Family stories:

Isaac was a "little mester" at Beaton Clark brass foundry. As such he had a work gang, and he received payment for the gang from the employer and then paid out the rest of the gang. He wasn't popular because he was thought to be receiving the lion's share.

He lived at Southview, Wellgate Mount, Rotherham. The house had a music room, a garden with nectarines growing up a wall, and a tennis court. The house no longer exists, the space currently being a car park.

Isaac did his own gardening, and was also a music teacher. He is recorded as the organist of Greesborough Church in 1879.

His wife Jemima was 9 years his senior.

On 31 Dec 1853 when Isaac was 22, he married **Jemima Howden** in Masbrough

Independant Chapel, Yorkshire. Isaac (23) was a mechanic from Thornhill, Masborough, father John, a machine maker. Jemima (30) was a spinster from Doncaster Gate, Rotherham, father Thomas, a farm labourer. Jemima was born in 1820. She was christened in Fishlake, Yorkshire, on 19 Nov 1820. Jemima died in Rotherham, Yorkshire, on 10 Oct 1891.

Jemima died at Wellgate Mount, aged 70, of cerebral paralysis, asthma, cardiac disease, dilatation, and albuminuria.

They had the following children:

- i. **Kate Laurette Warburton**. Kate Laurette was born in Masbrough, Yorkshire, on 3 Sep 1854. Kate Laurette died in Sheffield, Yorkshire, on 15 Aug 1936.

Kate was born at Thornhill, Masbrough, and the birth was registered on October 9th by her father who was described as a mechanic. She died at 689 Abbeydale Road, Sheffield, aged 81, of senile decay. She was the widow of John William Barlow, a gentleman's hosier.

Family stories:

Kate was a very mean person When her parents went on holiday leaving her in charge of the house she refused to use food from the full pantry and brother John Thomas had to buy himself pikelets which made him ill. When old she lived in lodgings and stored bits of crust in a drawer in case she became hungry.

On 11 Apr 1876 when Kate Laurette was 21, she married **John William Barlow** in Eastwood, St Stephen, Yorkshire. John (25) was a draper from Leicester, father John Dennis, a builder. Kate (21) was living in Eastwood, father Isaac, a machinist. Isaac and Mary Ann Warburton were witnesses. Kate and John had two sons and a daughter. John William was born in Oakham, Yorkshire, in 1851. John William died in Rotherham, Yorkshire, on 20 May 1883.

- 4 ii. **John Thomas Warburton** (1858-1947)
- iii. **Mary Ann Warburton**. Mary Ann was born in Masbrough, Yorkshire, on 14 Oct 1859.

Mary was born in Mary Street. Her birth was registered October 21st by her father Isaac, a machinist. In the 1911 census her husband was described as a journalist and newspaper reporter.

On 14 May 1884 when Mary Ann was 24, she married **Willis Brunt** in Rotherham, All Saints, Yorkshire. Willis (26) was a reporter from Altrincham, father Thomas a colliery deputy. Mary (24) was a spinster from Rotherham, father Isaac, a music teacher. Mary and Willis had three sons. Willis was born in Rotherham, Yorkshire, on 2 Jun 1857.

- iv. **Lizzie Howden Warburton**. Lizzie Howden was born in Masbrough, Yorkshire, on 4 Oct 1861. Lizzie Howden died in Masbrough, Yorkshire, on 11 Sep 1863.

Lizzie was born in Mary Street. her birth was registered on October 31st by her mother Jemima, formerly Howden. Her father was Isaac, a machinist. She died aged 33 months of hooping cough, and teething at 3 Mary Street. Her death was registered on September 12th by father Isaac.

## Fourth Generation

---

**4. John Thomas Warburton** (*Isaac<sup>3</sup>, John<sup>2</sup>, James<sup>1</sup>*). John Thomas was born in Masbrough, Yorkshire, on 6 Feb 1858. ■ Census for Chorlton-on-Medlock, Lancashire, in 1881. Thos (23) is a manager living at 46 Rosamund Street East with the Rogerson family, along with Annie (30). ■ Census for Rotherham, Yorkshire, in 1891. John T (33) is a clerk living at 17 Frederick Street with Annie (32), Lizzie (8), Annie (5), Betsy (3), and Isaac (1). ■ Census for Rotherham, Yorkshire, in 1901. John T (43) is a commercial clerk living at 26 York Road with Annie (50), Lizzie (18), Annie (15), Betsy (13), and Isaac (11). ■ Census for Rotherham, Yorkshire, in 1911. John Thomas (53) is an Accounts clerk with an accountants living at 45 St. Ann's Road with Annie (60), and Isaac (21) a grocer's assistant. John and Annie had been married 30 years and had 5 children, all living. John Thomas died in Rotherham, Yorkshire, on 29 Sep 1947.

John was born in Mary Street Masbrough. His birth was registered by his mother Jemima on March 29th naming his father Isaac, a mechanic.

### Family Stories:

John's father wanted him to be a lawyer but he was spoilt. He travelled by pony and was a weekly boarder at Roche Abbey School. He stayed at school until he was 18.

When he was first married he was living in Manchester with Walter Rogerson and his family. Daughter Clara was born in a pub. By the time Lizzie was born (1883) they had moved back to Sheffield, and then Rotherham.

John worked for Joseph Peck where people bought clothes 'on-tick' and paid weekly. He was suspected of either taking some money, or not keeping proper accounts. His father Isaac saved him from prison twice. He then worked as a rent and debt collector for Thompson and Wright. In later life he was allowed to go into the office whenever he liked but when he was 80 Mr Thompson came to his house to say he had to leave because he was chasing the girls.

He was 'a bit of a lad'. His wife was besotted by him. He was a gambler, and when his father left him £600 he drank and gambled it away saying "I'm not going to leave it to others to piss against the wall". He had lots of friends when he had money, but they disappeared when the money was gone.

He allowed his children to go about in rags. Daughter Anne was never given any money and

had to ask her grandfather Isaac for money to buy boots for the children. He was also a moaner. He rented parts of his house to relations but sold it and turned them out on the street.

He then moved in with daughter Annie who hired a solicitor to witness he was living with her to prevent him taking her goods. He used to go with Annie's husband Frederick Bower to Bakewell Fair in Derbyshire and they always brought a present (a tray, basket or trinket) for Annie.

In the war he refused to go down to the air-raid shelter in the cellar, saying he would "die in his bed".

He died at 22 Oakwood Grove, Rotherham, aged 89, a retired accounts clerk, of cardiac muscle failure, cerebral thrombosis, and senility. The informant was daughter Annie Bower.

On 8 Jan 1881 when John Thomas was 22, he married **Annie Gillatt** in Chorlton-on-Medlock, St Luke, Lancashire. At the time of their marriage John and Ann were living in Rosamund Street East, with Walter Rogerson and his family. John (23) was a clerk, father Isaac, a machinist. Annie (30) was a spinster father John, a brewer. Fanny Warburton was a witness. Annie was born in Eccleshall Bierlow, Yorkshire, on 25 Dec 1847. Annie died in Rotherham, Yorkshire, on 1 Mar 1917.

Annie was born at 260 Rockingham Street, Ecclesall Bierlow, father John, a carter, mother Ann, formerly Wheatman. The birth was registered on February 1st 1848 by her mother.

She attended Miss Lettall's school where she learned singing and dancing. She stayed at school until she was 18.

She died at 43 St Ann's Road, Rotherham, aged 65, wife of John Thomas, an accounts clerk, of bronchitis and endocarditis. The death was registered on March 2nd, by daughter Betsy Warburton.

They had the following children:

- i. **Clara Jemima Warburton**. Clara Jemima was born in Manchester, Lancashire, on 13 Sep 1881. Clara Jemima died in Hastings, Sussex, on 18 Aug 1960.

Clara was born at 38 Seal Street, Manchester, father John Thomas, an office clerk, mother Annie formerly Gillatt. The birth was registered on October 24th by her mother Annie.

Family stories:

She went to live with her grandfather Isaac when her mother was struggling to run a pub and have another child. She was still with him in the 1891 and 1901 censuses. When she could have returned home Isaac said “Only if you want to break my heart”.

She met husband Alf Watt at a theatre where they passed notes. St Stephen’s church where they married was almost opposite the St Anne’s Road house where she lived. Alf was a tall, thin, mean Scot. He took Clara to Gurock in Scotland to look after his aged parents until they died. He also would send her to the market at the last minute so she could buy cheap vegetables.

Alf was a top grade Civil Servant (in the Inland Revenue) and they went to live in Dorchester, and then Hastings. When he retired aged 45 he took on 2 or 3 private clients. When he died he left Clara their bungalow in Park View, Hastings for life, and a small sum of money administered through a solicitor. He wanted the bulk of his estate to go to his side of the family after her death, and it ultimately went to distant cousins in New Zealand.

She had a speech defect and was found dead in her bathroom. She died aged 78 at 12 Park View, Hastings, widow of Alfred James Watt, an income tax consultant, of cerebral thrombosis and hypertension. Her death was registered on August 18th by her sister Annie Bower of 49 Park View, Hastings.

On 15 Jan 1919 when Clara Jemima was 37, she married **Alfred James Watt** in Rotherham, St Stephens, Yorkshire. Alfred (26) was a civil servant of Leathercourt War Signal Station, St Margaret, Dover, father James, a joiner. Clara (37) was a spinster of 43 St Anne’s Road, father John Thomas, an accountant. Alfred James was born in Sheffield, Yorkshire, on 23 Jan 1883.

- ii. **Lizzie Warburton**. Lizzie was born in Sheffield, Yorkshire, on 23 Jan 1883.

Lizzie died in Harwarden, Flintshire, on 18 Aug 1920.

Lizzie was born at The Railway Hotel, Wicker, Sheffield, father John Thomas, mother Annie, formerly Gillatt, publican. The marriage was registered on March 5th by her father.

Family stories:

At one time Lizzie worked as a hospital nurse at night and carried a gun for protection.

First husband Walter was a forge or furnace man, and a whiskey drinker who died of pneumonia. A cure for pneumonia is to “get up to the crisis” with strong spirits but because Walter drank so much they had no effect.

Lizzie’s mother-in-law didn’t allow Lizzie any help with the birth of son Henry who weighed 14lbs. It was believed this triggered her cancer. Lizzie’s second husband Sam brought up her children after she died, until they left High School.

She died age 37, wife of Samuel Weigh a foreman at Harwarden Bridge Ironworks, at Laburnam Cottage, Aston, Harwarden, Flintshire, of malignant disease of the uterus. The death was registered on August 19th by Samuel Weigh.

On 24 Dec 1903 when Lizzie was 20, she first married **Walter Ward** in Kimberworth, Yorkshire. Walter (30) was a farmer from Kimberworth, father Henry, a turner. Lizzie (21) was from York Road, father John Thomas a bookkeeper. Walter and Lizzie had a son and daughter. Walter was born on 7 Oct 1871. Walter died in 1912.

Walter’s death is probably that registered in 1q 1912 Rotherham 9c 900, aged 39.

On 1 Nov 1919 when Lizzie was 36, she second married **Samuel Weigh** in Sheffield, St Michael and All Saints, Yorkshire. Samuel (35) was a steelworks foreman of 55 Firs Hill Road, father John, a miner. Lizzie (35) was a widow of 25 Burton Road, father John Thomas, an accountant. Samuel was born abt 1883. Samuel died in Harwarden, Flintshire, in 1950.

Samuel’s death is probably that registered in 1q 1950 Harwarden 8a 590, aged

67.

- iii. **Annie Warburton**. Annie was born in Eccleshall Bierlow, Yorkshire, on 2 Jun 1885. Annie died in Worthing, West Sussex, on 26 Mar 1980.

Annie was born at 36 Thorndon Road, Sheffield, father John Thomas a commercial clerk, mother Annie, formerly Gillatt. The birth was registered on July 14th by her father.

Family stories:

Annie would like to have been a dressmaker but her father wouldn't pay the apprentice fee. She and sister Betsey went into service for some farmers in South Mimms, Hertfordshire. They then returned to Rotherham and worked at Horsfalls confectioners and restaurant in the High Street. When Annie was scolded for dropping a dozen diner plates she said, "if you are not satisfied I will go".

Annie later recalled that if you looked up at the ceiling at Horsfalls you could see rats tails hanging down from the many holes in it. It was said that High Street was built on rats, and when a large property was pulled down a swarm of rats ran up Wellgate and then divided, one lot going up Old Hill, and the other up Quarry Hill.

After she was married she would have liked a corner shop, and tried to borrow £110 from friends but was refused.

Annie died at 20 Reigate Road, Worthing, of abdominal aortic aneurysm and generalised arteriosclerosis. The death was registered on May 27th by her daughter Beatrice from Shropshire.

On 30 Jul 1908 when Annie was 23, she married **Frederick Bower** in Northfield, Rotherham, Yorkshire. Annie and Frederick had two daughters including the mother of Robin Hunt. Frederick was born on 25 Jun 1884. Frederick died in Hastings, Sussex, in 1967.

Frederick's death is probably that registered in 2q 1967 Hastings 5h 364, aged 82.

- iv. **Betsy Warburton**. Betsy was born in Rotherham, Yorkshire, on 11 Jan 1888. Betsy died in York, Yorkshire, on 31 Jan 1958.



Betsey was born at 89 Eldon Road, Eastwood Vale, Rotherham, father John Thomas a commercial clerk, mother Annie, formerly Gillatt. The birth was registered on February 24th by her father.

#### Family Stories:

Betsey (aka) Betty had a boyfriend Holvey Greetham, a Guardsman, but he was wounded in the First World War and spent his days in a long wicker bath chair. During the war she did housekeeping jobs, and then went to work in the Post Office at St Bartholemew's, London. She came back pregnant and there was dark talk of the "back of the fire".

She met Willy Smart who owned a garage and two charabancs, one of which was called "The Gypsy Love". However he was married. He set her up in West Street with a shop and bakery.

When Willy's wife died he married Betty, with a "push" from his sisters and brother-in-law. Betty ran a cafe popular with local businessmen who came in for lunch. She was a good confectioner.

After living in Greasbrough they returned to Oxford Street, Rotherham. When Willy died he left her with a mortgage so she sold up and went to live with her sister Annie. She worked for Dr Coldray, and Elmhurst solicitors.

When she got the sack she went to Stratford on Avon and met Frank Grix who was in the army at the time. She married him and went to York, but never mentioned she was 20 years older than him. He was horrified to read her birth certificate when she died.

She died of cancer and was seen in St James's Hospital, Leeds by a nephew who was doing his medical training there. She died in the County Hospital, York, aged 70 of Flat 1 Burton Stone Lane, York, wife of Francis Tomlinson Grix, a railway clerk, of carcinoma of breast with secondaries to lungs. The death was registered on February 1st by Francis.

On 23 Feb 1928 when Betsy was 40, she first married **John William Smart** in Rotherham, Yorkshire. The marriage was registered in 1q 1928 Rotherham 9c 895. John (50) was a widowed grocer from Greasborough, father deceased. Betsey (40) was a spinster from Whiston, father J Thomas, a clerk. John William

was born in 1872. John William died in Rotherham, Yorkshire, on 19 Feb 1936.

On 10 Jul 1945 when Betsy was 57, she second married **Francis Tomlinson Grix** in Preston on Tees, Yorkshire. Francis (38) was a Lance Corporal, Royal Engineers (Railway Clerk) residing at Clareville, Elmwood Road, Eastcliffe, father Herbert a retired Railway Clerk. Betty (45) was a widowed confectioner residing at 41 College Street, Stratford on Avon, father John Thomas, a retired Accountant. Francis Tomlinson was born on 9 Oct 1906. Francis Tomlinson died in York, Yorkshire, in 1981.

Francis's death was registered in 2q 1981 York 2 2634, aged 76.

- v. **Isaac Warburton**. Isaac was born in Rotherham, Yorkshire, on 19 Jun 1889. Isaac died in Rotherham, Yorkshire, on 25 Jan 1963.

Isaac was born at 17 Frederick Street, Rotherham son of John Thomas a book keeper, and Annie, formerly Gillatt. The birth was registered on August 19th by his father.

Family stories:

Isaac was named after his grandfather in the hope he would follow his character and fortune, but being an only son he was spoilt. In the 1911 census he is a grocer's assistant. He was apprenticed to the grocer Henry Gough.

He joined the Royal Engineers on August 17th 1916 and from October 1916 until December 1918 he served in France as a Permanent Linesman. When he enlisted he was living at 43 St. Anne's Road, and a steelworker at the Rotherham Forge and Rolling Mills.

He later worked at Smart's grocers, and at a motor shop. He also worked on a traction engine for the Work House as a fireman or on the footplate.

He lived for a while with sister Annie and Fred at St Anne's Road, but when they moved to a smaller house and couldn't accommodate him he went to a Mrs Dawson in Carlyle Street.

He had a few girl friends but never married. He liked to be called Ernest and was so called by all but his close family. He liked whiskey.

He died at Moorgate General Hospital, aged 73, a general labourer (retired) of

22 Wharnccliffe Street, Rotherham,. He died of myocardial infarction and coronary thrombosis. The death was registered on January 30th by sister Annie. He was buried at Moorgate with his parents. Annie and Fred Bower paid for the funeral as he was without means and would have been buried in a pauper's grave otherwise.
